1. ABOUT JANATA COLLEGE

Janata College, established on 8th April 1964, stands as a testament to the vision and dedication of a galaxy of nationalists, philanthropists, and academicians who sought to spread the light of higher education in this remote region of Barak Valley. Situated at Kabuganj, approximately 20 kilometres south-east of Silchar in the Cachar district of Assam, the college has, for over six decades, served as a beacon of learning and social transformation.

From its modest beginnings with a small number of pre-university students operating out of Lakshmi Charan High School, Kabuganj (morning shift), Janata College has evolved into a premier co-educational institution. It caters primarily to a rural population, including students from SC, ST (Hills), ST (Plains), Tea Garden Labourer, OBC, and MOBC communities. As the only co-educational institution of its kind in this part of the valley, the college takes pride in its inclusive character and its significant contribution to women's education, reflected in the notably high enrolment of female students.

The college was initially affiliated with Gauhati University until 1993 and subsequently came under the jurisdiction of Assam University, Silchar, in 1994. It was granted permanent affiliation by Assam University during the academic session 2003–04. Over the years, the institution has steadily strengthened its academic foundation and institutional framework. It was brought under the Deficit System of Grants-in-Aid by the Government of Assam on 1st December 1975 and later provincialized on 1st December 2005. The college is recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under Sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956.

Janata College has undergone quality assessment by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), securing accreditation in Cycle I (2004, Grade C+) and Cycle II (2023, Grade C). Demonstrating its commitment to continuous improvement, the college has also submitted institutional data for the NIRF 2024–25 and 2025–26 ranking. In alignment with global sustainability goals, the college has declared its campus plastic-free under the motto "Beat the Plastic Pollution" as part of its engagement with the APEX SDG initiative.

The year 2024 marked a significant milestone in the institution's journey, as Janata College celebrated its Diamond Jubilee, commemorating sixty years of dedicated service to higher education in the rural landscape of Barak Valley.

Spread over approximately 7 acres of contiguous land, the college campus provides a conducive environment for academic and co-curricular activities. The campus features a government-constructed building enclosed by a pucca boundary wall, all-weather road connectivity, and a serene natural setting enriched by ample greenery, including a well-maintained botanical garden.

With its enduring commitment to accessibility, inclusivity, and academic growth, Janata College continues to play a pivotal role in shaping the educational and socio-cultural landscape of the region.

The HS programme offers compulsory subjects (English and MIL/Alternative English) alongside a choice of three elective subjects and one skill-based subject.

- Students may change their core course after completion of the 2nd semester, subject to achieving CGPA above 6.0 with no back papers.
- IDC courses opted shall remain the same for all three semesters; semester-wise change of IDC is not allowed.

20.2 Internal Assessment

Minimum 2 Unit Tests are held at both FYUGP and HS levels. Weightage is given to Unit Test results for sending up students for Council/University examinations. Results of all college examinations are published within 7 days from the last examination.

20.3 Attendance Requirement

A minimum of 75% class attendance is mandatory to appear in the Council/University examination as a regular candidate. Student attendance is generally displayed on the notice board before Puja vacation (September/October) for form fill-up.

21. DRESS CODE AND GENERAL DISCIPLINE

21.1 Regular Dress Code

Boys: Sky blue shirt (one frontal pocket, no pleat) and coffee colour pant (two side pockets, one right back pocket, no bottom fold). Black shoes and coffee colour tie are optional.

Girls: Sky blue churidar kameez (close round neck with 10-12 inches side cut, knee length) and coffee colour pyjama with dupatta (V-shape with 6 inches pleat).

Winter: Coffee colour sweater (close V-neck plain, sleeveless or full sleeves for boys; front open neck plain, sleeveless or full sleeves for girls).

Wednesday: House dress with respective house colour T-shirt (collar and rib in house colour with contrasting lines as specified).

21.2 Key Disciplinary Rules

- Students must always carry Photo-Identity Cards within the campus. Failure to produce them may debar students from attending classes.
- Use of mobile phones, cell phones, iPods, and MP3 players within the campus is strictly prohibited.
- Use of alcoholic beverages and hallucinatory drugs is strictly prohibited and will result in suspension or expulsion.
- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited by the Supreme Court of India and will make a student liable for punitive/disciplinary action.
- The courses at Janata College are full-time; no student may simultaneously undertake another full-time course or job.
- Students must be in college uniform with the college emblem while within campus.
- Political or communal involvement affecting peace and harmony in the campus is prohibited.
- Parking place should be used for parking of two-wheelers, cycles, cars, etc.
- All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Head of the Institution, whose decision shall be final.
- In case of emergency, a student can meet the Principal from 1:00 PM to 2:00 PM. Group entry inside the Principal's chamber is strictly prohibited.
